






Upcoming Events

The Burns Prize-giving takes place on 22nd February and we will be holding our own school Burns Concert on Friday 8th February to allow friends and family to come along and be entertained by our incredible performers.

Rainy and Icy Weather

In the event of bad weather in the morning (heavy rain, high winds, snow or ice) we will open the P5/6/7 door (beside the front of the school) and the P1/2 door (off the infant playground) at 8.45am to allow children to come straight into school and go to their classes.



In the case of very cold and icy conditions, two main pathways into the school are gritted, one from the front gate to the P5/6/7 door and a second from the back gate at Stonelaw to the P1/2 door. We appreciate that the playground can get very icy and gritting is concentrated on these two pathways in order to create two safe access routes into the building.



No Dogs in Playground

Just a reminder that, as per South Lanarkshire Council policy, dogs should not be brought into our school playground, even if they are being held. We greatly appreciate your support with this matter.


Staffing News
