- **Autumnal window displays:** Every class will be decorating their window for autumn/Halloween. There will be prizes for the most creative displays have a look as you pass through the playground to see who you think should win!
- **Scarecrow competition:** Many classes will be making scarecrows to display around the school (and hopefully outside). Again, there will be prizes for the most creative designs.
- **Halloween fun afternoon:** On Friday 30th October, pupils can come to school either dressed up or dressed down. If you child wishes to dress up for Halloween, they can come to school in a costume. Children should not bring masks or toys in with their costume (including toy weapons). Costumes should be worn all day, and not brought in to change into at lunchtime, so please ensure your child will be comfortable in their outfit. If your child does not want to dress up, they can dress down in comfortable clothes.
 - On Friday afternoon, every class will have fun games and activities in their room. Weather permitting, we may have some outdoor activities, too.
- **Pumpkins (supported by our Parent Council):** Every child in the school will bring home a decorated pumpkin picture. If you wish, you can display this in your window. Then, children can go on a 'pumpkin hunt' with their parents. Every time they spot a Calderwood pumpkin in a window, the parent pops a treat in their Halloween bag. This means that children can still get a treat without visiting other peoples' houses, and hopefully have a wee bit of fun in the process.






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Playground








Head Lice
