Staffing News

Head Lice

We have had reports of head lice in a number of classes throughout the school. Head lice can be a persistent problem, especially if left untreated, as they will continue to spread through classes. Please check your child's hair regularly for signs of head lice, and treat as necessary. Your local pharmacy will be able to advise you on appropriate treatments. I have also uploaded a leaflet to the App with more information. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Indoor Shoes

A reminder that all pupils should have a pair of indoor shoes kept in school to change into when they come into the building.

Our playground and many of the pavements around our school are very muddy and dirty at the moment. We want to keep our classrooms clean and our carpets in good condition, without mud (and other nasties) being dragged in by dirty shoes.

Please ensure you child has indoor shoes, and check with them that the ones they have in school still fit them. If the cost of aquiring new shoes is an issue, please contact the school (either myself or a member of the Senior Leadership Team) and we will organise for a pair to be purchased.



Driving and Parking Around the School

Driving and parking around the school continues to be a safety issue. As always, I would urge that you take extra care when driving close to the school.

- Please do not park on the yellow 'zig zags' at the front of the school. These are faded on one side of the road, and we are trying to address this with the relevant department in the Council, but please be aware that they are on both sides of the road and are designed to keep a safe, clear space at the front of the school.
- When you are dropping off or picking up, please do not park your car in front of the school in the staff car park, blocking parking spaces. This leads to congestion and blocks cars from coming through the car park or getting in or out of designated spaces. Currently, school staff are having to come out to patrol and speak to drivers on a daily basis. This puts the Senior Leadership Team in the uncomfortable position of having to confront parents. It is also not a valuable use of our time. Please be considerate to staff and prioritise the safety of our pupils.





Donations for Families in Ukraine

As some of you may already know, one of our current members of teaching staff, Mrs Yuliya Conroy, is Ukrainian. Mrs Conroy has been living in Scotland for many years, however, she still has family and friends back in Ukraine. The escalating conflict in Ukraine has been ongoing for almost a year now, and ordinary families are still bearing the brunt of this. Mrs Conroy works with friends in Scotland and volunteers in Ukraine to help get much needed supplies to the right places. I know that, as a school community we are always keen to offer charitable support both within our own community and beyond, and we want to do what we can to help, therefore we will be collecting items from the list below to be sent to Ukraine. All items collected will go directly to families in Ukraine. **Please donate** what you can, if you can. Thank you!

Many people currently live in basements as there is no electricity/ water/ heating in their flats or houses (if they are any standing at all). All of the items below would be greatly appreciated:

- warm clothes (sweaters, socks, thermal underwear, warm gloves and hats, etc)
- blankets, sleeping bags/ yoga mats (for sleeping on)
- hand warmers
- · candles and lanterns/flashlights
- anti-inflammatory medications (cough syrups, cold/flu pills, painkillers, etc) Please hand medicines into the school office – do not give to pupils
- first aid kits (any components: creams, bandages, etc.)
- long shelf-life foods (soups/meats/fish in tins, dry soups, teas, anything that can stay unspoiled for a long time)
